# Teacher Profile: Jenifer Chobotiuk

District – VSB no.39 School: Charles Dickens Elementary Role/Title – Resource Teacher



District – VSB no.39 School – Charles Dickens Elementary Role/Title – Resource Teacher

This year I am supporting 6 classes from grades 3-7. As a Resource Teacher I work collaboratively with Classroom Teachers and Student Support Workers (SSAs) in each of these classes. I am Case Manager for high and low incidence students, I provide Learning Assistance to students working below grade level, and I support all ELL students. School wide, I assess students using the KTEA-3 and am Chair of School Based Team.

What does your role as SBT Chair look like? As SBT Chair I am in charge of scheduling, both with school-based and itinerant staff, as well as ensuring we have referrals ready for both District and Ministry deadlines. In our District teachers complete a Pre-Referral Intervention Strategies form to outline the strengths and needs of the student they wish to bring to SBT as well as the Tier 1 interventions they have already put in place. Through discussion with the teacher, we can determine the urgency of their request to meet at SBT as well as whether other staff should be present (ie: psychologist, SLP, Counsellor, OT/PT, Indigenous Education Worker, etc.) As Chair I send out the agenda, set up the online meeting or book a space large enough to physically distance, and book supervision for the Classroom Teacher. During the meeting I ensure we stay on topic, manage the speakers list, keep minutes of the discussion, and ensure there is a plan in place moving forward.

Why did you want to become a Learning Assistance teacher? I have a strong desire to make classrooms accessible for ALL students and to help students learn about themselves and become strong self-advocates. I love my role in supporting kids, teachers, support workers, and families. I have worked in a variety of teaching roles (music teacher, classroom teacher, and enrichment/support teacher) in both elementary and middle/junior high schools. I discovered how much I was drawn to our more diverse learners and the puzzle of how to best meet their needs. I work best when collaborating with others and found that the Learning Assistance role allowed me to use this strength to support my students and my colleagues. I love to work with teachers to make their classes welcoming, supportive places for their students. I like collaborating with support workers to find unique ways of overcoming students' challenges. I appreciate all my opportunities to learn from experts in areas of literacy, math, social-emotional learning, sensory management, alternative communication, etc. I enjoy working with families so I can better understand and support their children. Finally, I especially love getting to know the students and understand what makes school enjoyable, what makes it difficult, and find ways to support them in finding success.
